



Covid-19: Arrangements for testing at schools
Declaration of participation for the academic year 2021/22
(Cycle 1)

December 2021

In the light of the evolution of the pandemic in the Grand Duchy, the health arrangements put in place by the Ministry of Education, Children and Youth have been adjusted for the academic year 2021/22. The **arrangements for testing** at schools are henceforth as follows:

- Base scenario = 0 positive cases in the class
- Scenarios 1 and 2 = 1 or 2 positive cases in a class
- Scenario 3 = as from the 3rd positive case in a class
- Scenario 4 = chain of infection at the school (several classes involved and/or more than 5 positive cases in a class)

Testing arrangements apply to pupils in cycle 1 in the context of the base scenario and scenario 1.

As long as the base scenario applies to the class, pupils in cycle 1 are to carry out three **rapid antigen self-tests each week, at home..**

In the context of scenario 1,

- the class is kept separated from the rest of the school community, and it is recommended that pupils do not attend daycare facilities (maison relais). Pupils who have recovered may continue to attend daycare facilities.
- the arrangements for testing at home are maintained.
- the persons concerned will receive a prescription by the Health Inspectorate for having a certified test carried out no earlier than the sixth day of the separation.

As soon as two positive cases are confirmed in a class, the pupils will be put into quarantine without authorisation to leave the house. The quarantine is lifted by a certified negative test (carried out on the basis of a prescription no earlier than six days after the last contact with the person who has tested positive).

Depending on the evolution of the virus within a school, the Health Inspectorate may propose cluster testing for the entire school. In this case PCR tests are carried out by the mobile teams of the National Health Laboratory (LNS).

Participation in the testing arrangements described above is **voluntary** and depends on the class teacher having received the **declaration of participation**, duly filled in and signed. Please note that consent may be given or withdrawn, in writing, at any time.
